

# Becoming A Deacon - Part 3 of 3



Towards the end of my formation in the diaconate, I began thinking of what I would say for my first homily and, how was I going to remember everything that I had to do. During the week leading up to my first mass I was told I needed to rewrite my homily because it had too much teaching and it just wasn't me. So I went to the adoration chapel the night before ordination and rewrote my homily that I was going to use the next day. I have to say it was better than I could have ever imagined and trusting in the Holy Spirit to help was all I needed to do.

Fr. Bordelon offered for me to meet with him after 7:00 mass so we could do a walk through of the mass. You see I have served as an alter server the past five years but, this mass was going to be different. Now I am serving as a deacon so going through it would help me not be so nervous. I spent an hour in adoration before mass praying and reading a prayer Mr. Clarence Arsement gave to me. The prayer asks the Holy Spirit to convert feelings of nervousness and apprehension into energy for proclaiming God's word. It helped me to get to a calming place and still today I use it before every mass.

I left adoration and went into the sacristy to get vested. I recited the vesting prayers that must be said every time a deacon is vesting, that moment was very special to the Book of the Gospels in my hand ready to process in Fr. Bordelon had to turn my

to me. After, I went to the back of church with the Book of the Gospels in my hand ready to process in. Fr. Bordelon had to turn my Book of the Gospels the right side up and I thank him for looking out for me, maybe I was a little nervous.

Once I sat down I started thinking of all the things I would need to do during mass and it started to overwhelm me. Then I focused only on what I had to do next, and it calmed me. Then it came time for me to proclaim the Gospel and, for some reason I was not nervous. I guess relying on the Holy Spirit helped me. I can remember after reading the Gospel and reciting my first homily feeling it was someone else and not me, because I should have been nervous. This was a good lesson for me to trust and rely on the Holy Spirit and, having Fr. Bordelon there helped me to remain calm.

The things that touched me during mass were my two daughters got to read the reading that day and, my two sons brought up the gifts. Having all of my family there was special but to have Josette there and to know she was praying for me helped me to keep it all together. Being next to the altar during the consecration is unexplainable. It brought so much peace and understanding as to why I am Catholic and why I was called to be a deacon.

I have been part of St Joseph parish for fifty-two years as a parishioner but now I get to serve my parish as a deacon. Serving at mass that day resonated with me that we are all a family here at St Joseph. There are many people that prayed for me for the last five years that I barely know and the out pouring of people at my reception touched my heart deeply. Please remember to pray for me as I will keep all the parishioners of St Joseph in my prayers.

# Pope Francis

#### Pope Proclaims Youth as Hope for Future

Resuming his General Audiences after a brief summer break, Pope Francis has said that the young continue to be a prophetic sign of hope for the future.

The Holy Father's strong words came in the wake of his 15th Apostolic Visit abroad and his first trip to John Paul II's homeland of Poland, July 27-31, which was the focus of his discourse this morning. This morning's audience was held in the Vatican's Paul VI Hall, rather than St. Peter's Square because of Rome's intense August heat.

The Holy Father pointed out how his pastoral visit to Poland for World Youth Day took place 25 years after the historic visit of Saint John Paul II following the fall of the Iron Curtain.

Even if Poland, Europe and the world have changed greatly since then, the Pontiff acknowledged, "the young continue to be a prophetic sign of hope for the future."

The Pope observed that as the thousands and thousands of young people waved the flags of their respective countries, they formed a mosaic of fraternity."

'The new generation of young people—inheritors and continuers of the pilgrimage initiated by Saint John Paul II—gave the answer to today's challenge," he said. "They gave a sign of hope, and this sign is called fraternity, because, in fact, in this world at war, we need fraternity, closeness, dialogue and friendship."

With its rich cultural and spiritual heritage, Poland, the Pope stressed, "reminds us that Europe has no future apart from its founding values, centred on the Christian vision of man and including the message of mercy expressed so eloquently in the last century by Saints John Paul and Faustina Kowalska."

The Pontiff also mentioned his emotional morning at Auschwitz-Birkenau, where he, in silence, pondered all that happened there and remembered the victims.

"Looking at that cruelty, in that concentration camp, I thought immediately of today's cruelties, which are similar: not so concentrated as in that place, but everywhere in the world; this world that is sick of cruelty, of pain, of war, of hatred, of sadness. And that is why I always ask you for prayer: may the Lord give us peace!"

Remembrance, he noted, "serves as a warning and a charge for our own time, so torn by conflicts, hatred and violence," he said, before thanking all those who made his visit possible.

The Pope expressed his hope that this visit "offered a sign of fraternity and peace to Poland, Europe and the world."
