On November 27, 1948 I was born 2 months pre-mature. I weighed 2lbs 9oz and was laid in a shoebox. My great uncle told the family "don't get too attached to this child because he won't survive". Well, after a year in an incubation room I was given the go ahead to be raised as normal. I grew up normally, and went to Catholic school. Being an only child and sheltered most of my youth I made mistake after mistake when I began my adult life. I finally surrendered and turned my life over to God. I had been in and out of grace, but I always had faith and went to mass and prayed for a change that I knew I needed. With a wife and three kids I realized I could be remembered as a party animal or I could be thought of as a sinner who turned back to Christ and confessed and was now forgiven.

I did a lot of things I am not proud of but finally after my Cursillo I started to realize that I was kept alive because God had plans for me. The only way I could realize His plan was to put all my love and trust in Him. He brought me out of a 30 year disability and knowing I had to do things that was for the greater glory. It was then that I realized that I may have a calling to the Diaconate Program.

I entered the diaconate program to see what it was all about and five years later I was ordained a deacon. With my 4-year anniversary behind me I am proof that if you trust and believe in Him, he will do the rest. I believe He has plans for each of us but we need to

slow down and listen so that if he called we can respond to that call and see what great things He can do through us. I love my Church, my parish and our priests. If you need I am always there for you.

Pope Francis



Are You Suffering? Look To The Cross

"To those who are nailed on a hospital bed, to those living closed in a prison, to those who are trapped by wars, I say: Look at the Crucified One; God is with you, He stays with you on the cross and offers Himself to all of us as Savior."

Pope Francis made this moving exhortation today during the general audience, when he gave a catechesis on Jesus' words during His Passion, namely those of forgiveness: "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34).

For the good thief, the Pontiff explained, these are not mere words, for Jesus truly forgives him. Yet, for the bad thief, Francis contrasted, it is inconceivable that the Messiah would remain on the Cross and not save Himself.

"But it is precisely by remaining on the Cross that Jesus offers salvation to every person regardless of their situation," the Pope said.

The Holy Father recalled that this Jubilee Year is a time of grace and mercy for all, the good and the bad, those in health and those who suffer.

"It is a time to remember that nothing can separate us from the love of God (cf. Rm 8:39)."

We learn a lesson from the good thief, Francis stressed, namely on how we should approach God.

When we approach Him with awe and respect for His power and infinite goodness, he noted, "we entrust ourselves to his mercy, even in the darkest of moments."

The Pontiff stressed to those gathered in the Square that God is always with us sinners, and he loves us even to death on the Cross.

"Let us see in the good thief a model of confidence in the Lord and, like him, let us call upon Jesus' name and ask him to remember us in Paradise," he said.

During today's audience, the Pope also renewed his appeal to help the suffering nation of Syria and decried unemployment in Italy.
