Retrouvaille Weekend

Retrouvaille will be held on January 20th-22nd in the Acadiana area. Retrouvaille is a ministry for couples in troubled marriages. Retrouvaille is French for rediscovery or reawakening. You may be more familiar with marriage encounter, which is intended to enrich good, stable marriages. Retrouvaille is more like a lifeline for troubled or broken marriages and hurting couples. It is for married couples who are anxious about their marriage, alone or distant from their partner, disillusioned or bored in their marriage, or who are experiencing coldness or conflict.

Locally, Retrouvaille of Acadiana hosts 3 weekends per year followed by the six post-weekend sessions on Sunday afternoons.

The weekends involve intensive work on communication skills and provide the foundation for the forgiveness and trust essential for rebuilding broken marriages. The six post-sessions frame up the concepts and provide practical solutions such as a method to resolve conflicts in a way that avoids the hurts of the past.

Retrouvaille is a peer ministry, meaning that all of the presenting couples are past attendees who came to Retrouvaille with marriages in trouble and who have firsthand experience of the benefits that can result.

Retrouvaille is a Catholic ministry and encourages individual and spiritual growth and the ultimate goal is to reinstall in hurting couples the joy and satisfaction of sacramental marriage.

The Respect of Attention

Our attention is sacred. You probably haven't thought of it as such but undivided attention to one particular subject is a true gift. While it may be great to receive, there are some scenarios where attention is practically expected.

Imagine going to grab dinner with a great friend that you love dearly. You don't get to see this friend as often as you like, so you cherish the time that you do have with them. Right after you order your food and you're about to see how they are doing, their attention has now vanished for an app on their phone. Rude, right? That's what we're doing when we pull out our phone during the Mass.

When we choose to look at our phone during Mass, we're putting our God second, and whatever is on our phone is first. Are we really going to pull ourselves away from a celebration as beautiful as the Mass for pixels on a screen? It doesn't matter what text, tweet, snapchat, or sports update it is; There is no notification on your phone that is more important than what is happening in the Mass.

When our attention and focus leave whatever we're focused on, we also lose some if its importance to us. To go back to the dinner analogy, if someone was to look at their phone during that time, than a little bit of time that should've been between two people is now gone. No matter what happens at that dinner, possible experiences and memories are now gone. The dinner has, more than likely, become less of an experience.

Similarly, when we choose to look at a screen during Mass, our attention is diminished and we might get less out of the Mass. Mass is a celebration but when we look at our phone, we might not get the full message of what that Mass has to offer. In order to get the full effect of the Eucharist, we need to give full attention to everything in the Mass.

Pope Says He Keeps Track of Death Anniversaries as Reminder Time Is Passing

Pope Francis today dedicated his homily at morning Mass in the Casa Santa Marta to a reflection on death.


Taking his cue from the day's reading from the book of Revelation, the Pope's homily focused on the reality of how all of us will face Jesus on the day of judgement, Vatican Radio reported.

The Holy Father acknowledged that death is not something we like to think about, but is a reality we all face. He said he keeps a diary in which he notes the date of a person's death, so that as each year passes and he sees the anniversary, he reflects on how time has passed.

The Pope said this obliges us to think about what we'll leave behind:



Pope Francis quoted from the Gospel reading that warns Christians not to be deceived. And the deception being spoken about, he explained, is alienation, estrangement, the deception of superficial things that do not have transcendence, the deception of "living as though we never had to die." When the Lord comes, the Pope asked, "how will he find me? Waiting for Him or in the midst of the many 'alienations' of life?"

"I remember as a child, when we went to catechism we were taught four things: death, judgement, hell or glory. After the judgement there is this possibility. 'But Father, this is to frighten us...' 'No, this is the truth because if you do not take care of your heart, because the Lord is with you and (if) you always live estranged from the Lord, perhaps there is the danger, the danger of continuing to live estranged in this way from the Lord for eternity.' And this is a terrible thing!"

Pope Francis concluded his homily by urging his listeners to think about their day of judgement and how they will fare but not to fear that moment because the Lord tells us, "remain faithful until death and I will give you the crown of life."

"Fidelity to the Lord does not disappoint. If each one of us is faithful to the Lord, when death comes, we will say like Francis (of Assisi) 'come sister death...' we won't be afraid. And when the day of judgement comes, we will look at the Lord: 'Lord I have many sins but I have tried to be faithful.' And our Lord is good. I give you this advice: 'be faithful until death – said the Lord – and I will give you the crown of life.' With this fidelity we won't be afraid of death, when we die we won't be afraid of the day of judgement."
