# Do you have a favorite topic that we've covered so far?



## Update on Centennial Campaign

At the end of January, we received our first parish rebate for the campaign in the amount of \$62,100. We will continue to receive these rebates every six months until the conclusion of the campaign. As you recall 30% of all funds given are returned to the parish for local needs and projects.

This means that so far our parish has given a total of \$207,000 to the campaign! Breaking it down further: \$51,750 has been given for seminarian education; \$47,610 for priest retirement; \$24,840 for campus ministry; and \$20,700 for Catholic Outreach and Services.



I can't begin to express how proud I am of our parish. All the while we have done a good job maintaining regular offertory to pay for ongoing operational expenses. This extra money allows us to first address the major maintenance needs on the exterior of the church (\$98,500) and rectory (\$17,000).
