

\$8,935.39 The deliberate murder of an innocent person is gravely contrary to the dignity of the human being, the golden rule, and to the holiness of the Creator (CCC 2261). Euthanasia which consists of putting to death the sick, the disabled, or the dving, regardless of the motives or means, is never morally permissible. Physician-Assisted Suicide is suicide performed with the aid of a doctor. The emergence of physician-assisted suicide, popularized by the right-to-die movement, seeks to legalize what is an immoral act. (CCC 2277).

Monthly Giving

Ever consider direct deposit or scheduled monthly credit card offerings?

This is how direct deposits work:

- -You complete a "Direct Deposit Authorization" form savings account for the amount and on the date you
- -We make withdrawals on the 2nd and 16th of each month (when the 2nd or 16th falls on a weekend or banking holiday the withdrawal will occur the next banking day)
- -You determine the amount and frequency of your donations

For credit card donations:

- You simply fill out your information on the parish website and the amount you would like to give monthly and you are all set.


