

Fete-Dieu du Teche will host the third annual Eucharistic Procession down Bayou Teche on Tuesday, August 15. The date is important for Roman Catholics as it is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is also a day that marks the bicentennial of St. Martinville and the 252nd anniversary of the arrival of French Canadian immigrants who brought the Catholic faith to Acadiana after enduring great trials and suffering. Hundreds will travel by boat to celebrate this occasion in honoring the Blessed Sacrament and Acadian heritage. Last year thousands travelled from throughout south Louisiana to gather along Bayou Teche.

Solace in Suffering

It's no secret that we live in a broken world. Every day we see violence, suffering, pain. So we turn to God for peace and consolation, but when something goes terribly wrong, we turn around and blame Him, wondering what we did to deserve such a thing.

Let me let you in on a little secret: Being a faith-filled Christian doesn't change the world we live in. We are always going to be surrounded by all of the awful things the world holds, because there will always be people in this world that live for their own selfish goals instead of God's. Turning your life over to God most assuredly offers guidance and peace, but the fact that it doesn't change your surroundings means that you won't meet fewer obstacles. In some cases, you'll meet more obstacles because the devil doesn't want you out of his grasp. Persevering through these hard times is no easy task.

Suffering is inevitable. It was inevitable for Jesus Christ Himself as He died, nailed to a cross, feeling every pain we've ever felt; every single one of us. Our suffering compared to His will always be minute and there should be no doubt in our minds that He understands our pain. Remembering this can make it easier to persevere.



But if we suffer either way, what do we gain by being Catholic? Eternal life, for one. Also, though, we gain support in our sufferings and the opportunity for redemptive suffering, where we can offer up our pain in prayer for others as well as ourselves for salvation and reparation for our sins. In this way, our suffering is worth everything and can become truly beautiful.

Pope Francis

The line between good and evil runs through each of our hearts....

Pope Francis reminded faithful of this in St. Peter's Square during his Sunday, July 23, 2017, Angelus address at noon as he reflected on yesterday's Gospel.

While admitting that "good and evil can not be identified with defined territories or certain human groups," Francis stressed the necessity of understanding that in each person's heart, there is that border between good and evil.

"In this world," the Pope highlighted, "good and evil are so intertwined that it is impossible to separate them and to extinguish all evil."

Therefore, the Holy Father explained, the only thing to do really is: "the difficult exercise of discernment between good and evil."

The Pope called on all baptized to "distance themselves from evil and its seductions," while highlighting "we are all sinners," and "we always need to be forgiven of our sins."



Evil often tries to convince us to not recognize our sins, Pope Francis said, as he gave an example of how instead we are to open up, without fear of that which is "dirty" or "unclean."

"Patience means preferring a Church that is leaven in the dough, Who does not fear soiling Her hands, washing the clothes of Her children," he said, "rather than a Church of 'pure ones,' that pretends to judge before 'the time' who is and who is not, in the Kingdom of God."

Before praying the midday prayer and appealing for peace in Jerusalem in the wake of recent escalated violence, Pope Francis prayed: "May the Virgin Mary help us to pick up in the reality that surrounds us not only the filth and evil but also the good and beautiful; to unmask Satan's work but especially to trust in God's action that makes history fruitful."
