

RCE Asks: Did You Know?

The First Council of Nicaea was the first ecumenical council after Biblical times (a council in Jerusalem is recorded in the Book of Acts). It established a precedent for Bishops and other leaders of the Church to meet and decide matters pertaining to church doctrine, beliefs and practices. The Nicene Creed was decided at the First Council of Nicaea. Its purpose is to state the beliefs of the Church. The date of the Resurrection celebration was decided upon as the first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox. Many other issues were also discussed at the First Council of Nicaea.
