The Sanctuary Lamp



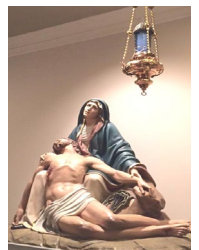

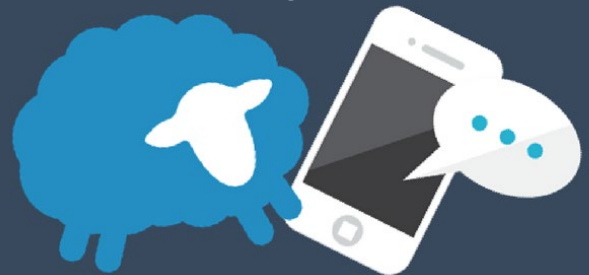

60 Days: Love thy Neighbor

If you have a solid prayer routine but are looking for a new approach, this heftier challenge is for you. Take 60 days this summer to practice the art of intercession, focusing on one person at a time. Praying for others is a great way to dig deeper and take your prayer life to the next level. Selflessness is hard, but this level of commitment will strengthen your humility and self-discipline. Choose 60 names — they can be family members, friends, coworkers, people you've lost touch with, celebrities, politicians, literally anyone! Write them down on individual pieces of paper and keep them in a jar. Pull from out a name each day and devote your prayer to that person.

Where to Start:

There are many ways to offer prayer for others. As you acknowledge their beauty and intercede for their holiness, you can also fast for them, offer a rosary for their needs, spend a few minutes in front of the Blessed Sacrament, recite a Hail Mary for them first thing in the morning or last thing before bed, offer them up in Mass, go on a run and offer the struggle for them — the possibilities are endless!

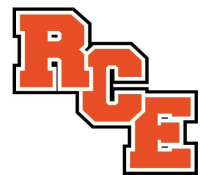

St. Athanasius of Alexandria:

St. Athanasius (296-373 A.D.) was born in Alexandria, Egypt, to noble Christian parents. He received an excellent education in theology, philosophy, rhetoric, and law, which he directed to the service of God. St. Athanasius is known as one of the greatest champions of Catholic doctrine to have ever lived, earning the title, "Father of Orthodoxy." St. Athanasius was later declared a Doctor of the Church. His feast day is celebrated on May 2nd.
