Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to assisted suicide. But the same polls show that people's views

shift when they learn about its dangers-especially the dangers for those who are poor, elderly, Assisted disabled, or without access to good medical care. Consider that, in Oregon and California, some patients' health insurance offered to pay for assisted suicide, but not
