
Mausoleum VII

MISSIONARY

Melise Gossen

My name is Melise Gossen and I come to you today to share how the Lord has called me to serve as a FOCUS missionary, which is the Fellowship of Catholic University Students. I am excited to announce that I was assigned to serve students at the University of Kansas, in Lawrence, Kansas. I'm looking forward to sharing the gospel and living life with college students, allowing them to understand who Jesus is and the love He has for us.

I grew up in Rayne and have attended mass here at St. Joseph all my life. I went to school at Rayne Catholic and graduated from Notre Dame. I then played collegiate softball at Nicholls State University.

Like many in our Parish, I grew up Catholic. I went to Catholic school from kindergarten to twelfth grade, but as I reflect upon it now, my faith was more like a mental check-box list. It wasn't until I went to college that it became my choice. I played softball at Nicholls State University in Thibodaux, Louisiana, and those were the most transformative years of my life. A focus missionary invested time in me: teaching me about prayer, authentic friendship, and how to bring the Lord into daily living. I journeyed into the deeper meanings of the Catholic Church and who God was. I grew to know the love of the Lord and His mercy.

After prayer and discernment to become a FOCUS missionary myself, the Lord placed a zeal upon my heart to reach the souls of other college students who were just like me. As a focus missionary we are called to be on college campuses because the need is so important:

- -66% of college students are lonely
- -55% feel hopeless
- -45% feel so depressed that they find it difficult to function

College is the time when so many people leave the faith. As a missionary, I am there to love them where they are, be a mentor for them, and ultimately teach them how there is only one person who will truly satisfy those feelings and questions—Jesus.

In August, I start my two-year commitment to be a full-time missionary, but I cannot go without partnering with caring and generous people like you! In order to make it to Kansas, I need to build a support team of faithful and consistent financial and prayerful supporters. As the great Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta said, "All of us are called to mission. Some give by going; some go by giving. Without both, there is no mission." You have a chance to go, through me. 



First Friday Mass & Adoration

The first Friday of the month is often marked by special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) reported visions of Jesus Christ directing her to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on nine consecutive First Fridays in reparation for sins and in order to show love to Jesus. In return for this act of devotion, which usually includes Mass, Communion, confession and even an hour of Eucharistic Adoration, our blessed Savior reputedly promised St. Margaret Mary the following blessings:

"In the excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour."

Please join us every first Friday of the month for 6:30am Mass followed by Adoration from 7-8am. Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours!
