

First Friday Mass & Adoration

The first Friday of the month is often marked by special devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) reported visions of Jesus Christ directing her to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on nine consecutive First Fridays in reparation for sins and in order to show love to Jesus. In return for this act of devotion, which usually includes Mass, Communion, confession and even an hour of Eucharistic Adoration, our blessed Savior reputedly promised St. Margaret Mary the following blessings: "In the excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour." Please join us every first Friday of the month for 6:30am Mass followed by Adoration from 7-8am. Sacred Heart of Jesus, make my heart like yours!

Baptism

What is baptism?

A sacrament instituted by Christ to cleanse us from original sin and actual sin, and which makes us children of God and members of His Church.

When did Jesus Christ institute the sacrament of baptism?

According to common teaching it was when Our Lord Himself was baptized in the Jordan River by St. John the Baptist, later commanding His disciples to baptize.

Is baptism of very great importance?

Yes. No other sacrament can be received before baptism, it cannot be repeated, and no one can be saved without receiving its sanctifying effects.

What obligation therefore rests on all parents?

All parents must seek baptism for their children as soon as possible, as it is a serious sin to risk the loss of a child's soul.

Why can infants be baptized, if they do not have a personal faith?


Infants have been baptized from apostolic times, in view of the supplied faith of the Church, represented by their godparents.

What are the effects of baptism?

1. It gives sanctifying grace, which regenerates us in Christ Jesus; 2. It gives a new birth in the Holy Spirit, making us adopted children of God the Father; 3. It makes us members of the Church; 4. It washes away all sin; 5. It imparts a sacramental character, indelibly imprinted on the soul.

Why do defects remain after baptism?

Because our earthly life remains one of pilgrimage on the way to heaven, and these defects are opportunities to obtain greater merit and a higher degree of glory in the next life.
